3. Board Member Issues	<ul> <li>Kurt Touet informed the board that Gas Inspections is moving to TSASK in the near future. Plumbing inspections are believed to be moving to TSASK as well, time line is unsure.</li> <li>Board discussed the Domestic Gasfitter License examination. The board would like apprentices to have the opportunity to write their gas exam during training as it was done previously. The board has heard complaints that having to wait a month or more after training to write the exam is holding back apprentices from writing the examination. The board feels the current process for the General Gasfitter License examination is working efficiently.</li> </ul>	Carried.	Quinn La Valley to investigate the procedure to change the time frame that apprentices are able to write the Domestic Gasfitters examination.
	<ul> <li>Board members have concerns that work is being completed based on a gas ticket in the office, not individuals that do not have ticket</li> <li>The board discussed Levels 3 and 4 of training. The board would like to see a week of training be added to both levels. The board would like to have additional hydronic training (troubleshooting boilers and controls) added, and Plumbing Code added to level 4 as this is removed from harmonization. Quinn La Valley explained that the board needs to build a business case that shows exactly what is needed to be added to training and that it has full industry support.</li> <li>Chris Gerl asked to have the harmonized curriculum sent to him for review.</li> <li>Quinn La Valley explained that the new Plumber IP Examinations will be released October 28, 2019. Should training include the whole gas code book? The board feels yes all aspects should be taught and systems with greater than 400,000 Btu's should be taught.</li> <li>Wes Noble asked for a wall hung boiler donation.</li> <li>Wes Noble asked the board for donation of a set of plans (commercial) and spec books.
